You will be advised at an early date of their findings and a meeting will be arranged with your representatives to discuss and finalize the committee's recommendations.



Enclosed find a Junior Olympic borchure and a photo of myself. I am forwarding your letter to Mr. Harry Hainsworth in New York, who will send you the other items you have requested, including a copy of the national rankings, in which appears an article written by me that you might use in your publication.

The results of the 1960 "Indoor" championships were not accepted because of the many violations of the regulations which were evident - the "Outdoor" results were accepted. I would appreciate it if you would change the name of your Indoor and Outdoor Junior Olympic Championships to conform to our's, namely "Short Course" and "Long Course". It is a minor point, but it would be more in keeping with what all the other Associations are doing.

Your plan to run trials on other Islands seems to be well in order, as well as your plan to have eight finalists and two alternates. It is only important that everyone in your Association have the opportunity to compete.

I am delighted that there is a new committee handling this program in the Islands and I am hoping this year we will not have the problems we did during the past season.

Thank you for your interest in this program.

WAYNE TANAKA

Maui's unceasing efforts to develop "local product" swimming champions has been going on for more than two decades, but not since Coach Soichi Sakamoto's heyday as the astute, exacting, tireless trainer of the Three-Year Swimming Club has the Valley Island held a prominent place on the world's swimming map.

The 3-YSC was at the height of its greatness in 1940, the year Tokyo was to play host to the XIV Olympiad. World War II shattered all the dreams and hopes built up by Sakamoto and his devoted young students in their three-year training program.

With the exception of William (Bill) Smith, none of the 3-YSC members realized their one big aim --- to compete in the Olympic Games.

Smith, whose brilliant career was interrupted by duty in the armed service, won 19 free style titles in National AAU and National Intercollegiate competitions in a seven-year period -- 1943 (the year he left Maui) to 1949.

As a member of Mike Peppe's famed Ohio State University teams, perennial rulers in the intercollegiate battles, Smith made the 1948 United States Olympic swimming squad and went on to win gold medals in the 400-meter free style and the 800-meter free style relay.

Smith's 3-YSC teammates included such prominent "Hall of Fame" candidates as Kiyoshi (Keo) Nakama and Takashi (Halo) Hirose, who also gained national fame as members of the Buckeye squad; Bunmei (Bunny) Nakama, Jose Balmores, Charley Oda, Benny Castor, and Bill Neunzig, Jr.

Their greatness can be measured by the

following records:

1938 --- Maui's first representatives in national meets were Kiyoshi Nakama and Takashi Hirose who, accompanied by Coach Soichi Saka-

moto, competed in the senior outdoor championships at Louisville, Ky. Hirose was a close second to Adolph Kiefer in the 220-yard free style, while Nakama was runner-up to Ralph Flanagan in the 440, 880 and mile races.

1939 --- Sakamoto and Manager E. L. Damkroger led a five-man Alexander House Community Association team to Detroit, Mich., where the Valley Islanders surprised by grabbing the team championship. With Nakama, 220-yard free style champion, and Hirose were Jose Balmores, Bill Neunzig, Jr., and Benny Castor. The Mauians also won the 880-yard free style relay.

1940 --- "Keo" Nakama lost his 220 title to Otto Jaretz in Santa Barbara, Calif., but won the 440 and 880 free styles, while brother, Bunmei Nakama, making his debut in national competition, captured the mile. The Nakama brothers, together with Hirose and Balmores, retained the 880-yard relay crown and the team championship.

1941 --- The same quartet, rejoined by Smith with Charles Oda added, won the team title for the third consecutive year at Maplewood, Mo. Hirose at 100 meters, Smith at 200 and 400, and "Keo" Nakama at 800 and 1500, swept the free style races; Balmores took the 200 breast stroke and 300 individual medley, and they once again brought back the 800-meter relay title. The team amassed 71 points to runner-up Chicago Towers Club's 21, copping eight first place medals, five seconds, four thirds, and two fourths.

1942 --- Because of existing war conditions, Smith competed as Maui's lone entry at New London, Conn., and shattered world free style records at 220, 440 and 880 yards. He went directly to Ohio State University to join "Keo" Nakama, who set a world's record for the mile and swam on the record-breaking 880-yard relay team competing for the Buckeyes.

The Valley Island also had her share of distaff champions, including a pair of two-time winners in the National AAU Women's Outdoor Meets.

Fujiko Katsutani Matsui, who was forced to withdraw from the 200-meter breast stroke in 1941, won at 220 yards both in Des Moines, Ia., and Portland, Ore., in 1939 and 1940. Chieko Miyamoto Enos made her debut in Portland by copping the 330-yard individual medley and defended the title at 300 meters the following year at High Point, N. C.

The only Mauian carving a niche in the national swimming picture since the pre-war era is Kenneth Nakasone, University of Indiana sophomore completing his second varsity season with the Hoosier squad.

The chubby 20 year old Puunene lad, Hawaii's premier breast stroker a few years back while attending Baldwin High, reached the peak of his young career in the fall of 1959 as America's

leading qualifier for the Pan-American Games.

Duke Kahanamoku, Warren Kealoha, Pua Kealoha, Manuella Kalili, Buster Crabbe, Ford Konno, Dick Cleveland, Yoshinobu Oyakawa, Bill Woolsey, George Onekea, Thelma Kalama, Evelyn Kawamoto, Judith Murakami, Catherine Kleinschmidt and Ivanelle Hoe are among other national and world swimming figures Hawaii has contributed.

The development program, more intensive than ever, goes on with more leaders, more clubs, and more supporters lending their time and effort to give more youngsters the opportunity to "get up there".

The Junior Olympic program, started only three years ago in the Islands, is just one of the many vital steps to the stardom that awaits our youngsters.

Realization of the dreams and hopes of the present-day staff of coaches, trainers, officials and committeemen, serving in various capacities throughout the 50th State, is sure to come in 1964.

A PEDIATRICIAN'S VIEW



DR. MARION HANLON

Dr. Hanlon, a pediatrician with the Maui Medical Group previously was physician for the Kamehameha School in Honolulu. Maui is very fortunate to have a physician of Dr. Hanlon's caliber.

. . .

As a physician especially interested in young people, this writer is a firm believer in sports. However, I also firmly believe that every athlete or sportsman, young or old, should temper his enthusiasm with self-control and discretion. Perhaps I can clarify my position in the next few paragraphs.

When I speak of sports I do not include the professional athletes and their display of skills. Such individuals obtain their livelihood from entertaining the public and should be classified with other professional entertainers. In our discussion, we will only consider the amateur who participates in sports for fun and relaxation.

Sports should never be allowed to usurp the major portion of a young person's life. Rather, sports should take their place along with academic school work and participation in family functions and functions of the church and community. This perspective should be developed early and maintained into adult life when school gives way to jobs or professions and the family position is changed from son to husband and father or from daughter to wife and mother.

The value of sports are many. The benefits

are to the total person and so might be classified as improved physical development, improved mental acuity, and improved emotional stability. Realizing that the amount of benefit obtained depends upon the individuals attitude toward sports, let me enlarge upon these benefits.

We all realize that exercise improves muscle strength and coordination. It also improves circulation and the capacity and efficiency of the lungs. Mental acuity is improved by the need, in many sports, to make rapid decisions in time of excitement and stress. Emotional stability is improved by experience in accepting failure as well as success and by discipline in self-control.

Self-control is important for the successful athlete. Continued training and practice requires much perseverance. Proper sleep habits must be maintained and proper food habits developed. Bad habits must be rejected. Alcoholic beverages decrease the ability to perform. Smoking decreases the circulation and reduces the efficiency of the heart. Improper boy-girl conduct may affect mental alertness and tempt a break in training habits.

Of interest to the young athlete are recent experiments on diets. We all are acquainted with the popularity of "hi-protein" pills. Recent studies on young people have shown that increased protein intake, above the normal requirements, cause a decrease in available energy and increases the loss of vitamins from the body. This, then, emphasizes the importance of an adequate diet without the extra "fads".

As this is being written primarily for you who have a special interest in swimming, I would like to point out a few of the features of swimming which make it an especially desirable sport.

Swimming is an excellent sport for individual participation but can also be a team sport. Even more important, it can be a family sport as it is one which almost any age can enjoy. It is a sport that develops physical fitness to a greater degree than many others. In Hawaii, it is a year around sport and is also important in self-preservation. Last, but not least, it can be combined with other hobbies such as fishing, shelling, or surfing.

In conclusion, then, may I emphasize that sports can be beneficial if the proper attitude is developed toward them and that swimming should be rated as one of the best of sports.


